#### Tryouts

Our teams are formed through a player tryout process. The tryout fee is \$10.00. Be sure to check our website for venue, date or time changes before attending any tryout session.

#### Practice and Game Locations

Our teams enjoy first-rate facilities. Teams practice and play on grass fields owned by the Northshore School District and the City of Bothell. When the grass fields close, practices and games move to the lighted turf fields at Inglemoor, Bothell and Woodinville High Schools, Pop Keeney Stadium and the North Creek fields. Few other clubs have access to the quality of fields FC Alliance enjoys.

#### Practice Schedules

Immediately after team formation, teams will be assigned a Mon-Wed or Tues-Thurs practice schedule. Practice locations and times may change through the year. FC Alliance also offers Goalkeeper Training, Friday Night Lights Club Training, plus the Academy of Excellence. The extra training is a great opportunity to learn, get more touches on the ball, and to meet other FC Alliance players in our unique friendly club atmosphere.

\$166 Initial payment  
\$166 per month (9 payments, credit or debit)  
\$100 - \$200 Team Fee: for tournaments and misc. expenses.  
\$225 Uniform expense (every two years): Includes, home and away jerseys, shorts, two pairs of socks, warm-ups and backpack.

#### U11 Developmental Teams (U10)

\$151 Initial payment  
\$151 per month (6 payments, credit or debit)  
\$100 - \$150 Team Fee: for tournaments and misc. expenses.  
\$88 Uniform expense: Includes, home and away jerseys, shorts and two pairs of socks.

#### Pre-Season Tournaments

FC Alliance encourages teams to participate in 2-3 summer tournaments around Western Washington, and/or out of state for older players. Teams may participate in more tournaments if approved by the FCA Executive Committee. Tournaments are a great opportunity for the players and families to bond, have fun, and create great memories of their competitive soccer days. They are also an important tool in gauging the team's developmental benchmarks and preparing for league play.

#### League Play

FC Alliance plays in the Player Development League (PDL), Washington State Premier League (WSPL), Washington State Youth Development League (WSYDL) and District 3.

#### State Cups Tournaments

Teams have three tournaments to choose from depending on their league placement, the Championship Cup, Challenge Cup and Commissioners Cup. State cup play begins at the end of season play with a guarantee of at least three games; after that, your team keeps playing until they lose or win the Finals.

- Fall League Play 2009: September – November (Dec)
- State Cup: January - March

##### GU16 – GU18 teams

- Pre-Season 2009: May - January
- Fall League Play 2009: January – March
- State Cup: April - May
