Tryouts

Our teams are formed through a player tryout process. The tryout fee is \$15.00 online at fcalliance.com or \$20 at the field. Be sure to check our website for venue, date or time changes before attending any tryout session.

Field Locations

Our teams enjoy first-rate facilities. Players practice and play on fields owned by the Northshore School District, the Cities of Bothell and Woodinville. Few other clubs have access to the quality of fields FC Alliance enjoys.

Practice Schedules

Immediately after team formation, teams will be assigned a Mon-Wed or Tues-Thurs practice schedule. Practice locations and times may change through the year. FC Alliance also offers Goalkeeper Training, Friday Night Lights Club Training, plus the Academy of Excellence. The extra training is a great opportunity to learn, get more touches on the ball, and to meet other FC Alliance players in our unique friendly club atmosphere.

FCA Player Costs

Club Fees are set via a yearly budget process, and cover the many expenses required in providing a premier soccer program – these include, player registration, insurance, field rentals for practices and games, referee fees, equipment purchases, additional training for coaches and players, scholarships for qualified players and the cost of coaches.

\$225 Uniform expense (every two years): Includes, home and away jerseys, shorts, two pairs of socks, warm-ups and backpack.

U10 Premier Developmental Teams - \$1,103

\$275 Initial NYSA payment
\$138 per month (6 payments, credit or debit)
\$100 - \$150 Team Fee: for tournaments and misc. expenses.
\$90 Uniform expense: Includes, home and away jerseys, shorts and two pairs of socks.

Pre-Season Tournaments

Teams participate in 3-5 summer tournaments around Western Washington, and/or out of state for older players. Tournaments are a great opportunity for the players and families to bond, have fun, and create great memories of their competitive soccer days. They are also an important tool in gauging the team's developmental benchmarks and preparing for league play.

League Play

FC Alliance Premier teams play in the Player Development League (PDL) and the Washington Youth Soccer League (WYSL).

State Cups Tournaments

Teams have two state tournaments to choose from depending on their league placement, the Championship Cup and Challenge Cup. State cup play begins at the end of season play with a guarantee of at least three games; after that, your team keeps playing until they lose or win the Finals.
